POLICY

PROCESS

When complaints are received the University will:

- Take action in response
- Ensure measures are taken to stop adverse behavior
- Prevent recurrence

All complaints of sexual misconduct will receive a prompt, fair, respectful and impartial investigation and resolution. This process is described in the *Policy Prohibiting Discrimination, Harassment, Sexual Misconduct and Retaliation*.
