



NOTICE: PRIVATE PROPERTY

The University of Redlands campuses in Redlands, CA; Burbank, CA; and the Town of San Anselmo, CA are PRIVATE PROPERTY.

The University permits access to authorized users only. Authorized users include:

1. All current employees and students and their invited guests.
2. Individuals and entities who have been invited onto campus for legitimate business or educational purposes. This includes:
 - a. Prospective students, alumni, and donors.
 - b. Parents and family members of current or prospective students.
 - c. Students, faculty, and staff of other institutions and other members of the public who have curricular or co-curricular activities on campus (*e.g., guest lecturers, conferences, athletic competitions*).
 - d. University vendors, other business partners, and other invitees with a legitimate academic or business purpose on campus.
 - e. Licensees and their permitted guests for use within the terms of their license (*e.g., entities who have leased any portion of the premises for use*).
 - i. Members of the public who wish to use the Armacost Library on the Redlands campus, in accordance with public access [visitor policies and the Armacost Library Community Agreement policy](#) Libraries on the other campuses are not open to the public.
 - f. Unaccompanied minors who are not participating in a university-sponsored program, event, tour, or other authorized activity are not considered authorized users of university property.
3. Members of the local community are authorized to traverse outdoor areas of the campus on designated walkways peacefully. This limited license does not permit entry into buildings without permission from authorized personnel. Community members must also comply with all campus rules and regulations, including safety requirements regarding skateboards, bikes and e-bikes, and other wheeled devices (motorized and non-motorized), keeping dogs on a leash, and adherence to any other posted signage or directives.

Individuals who are barred from campus due to no trespass orders or as a result of University administrative processes may not come onto campus property except as allowed by the terms of their no trespass orders.



All others wishing to enter the University's private property must present themselves at the following locations before proceeding to other areas of campus and only with the consent of authorized personnel:

1. Redlands: Ken and Lynn Hall Welcome Center or Public Safety Office
2. Woodbury: Campus Security/Information Booth at the Main Entrance with Campus Security Officer
3. San Anselmo: Property Manager, 105 Seminary Rd (Montgomery Hall)

Except in cases of emergencies, members of local, state and national law enforcement are asked to contact Public Safety at 909-748-8888 or the Office of the General Counsel at 909-748-8076 before entering any of the campuses.

The University reserves all rights to press charges and seek lawful redress of violations of private property.
